Course Title: Women and Politics.

Course Duration: 34 hours.

Course Outcome:

- 1. Develop a comprehensive understanding of the historical and contemporary roles of women in politics.
- 2. Analyze the factors that have influenced women's participation in political life, including cultural, social, economic, and institutional factors.
- 3. Explore the inter-sectionality of gender with other identities, such as race, ethnicity, class, sexuality, and disability, in shaping women's political experiences.
- 4. Examine the barriers and challenges faced by women in pursuing political leadership positions, including stereotypes, biases, and institutional discrimination.
- 5. Evaluate the impact of women's political participation on policy outcomes, governance, and democratic representation.
- 6. Critically assess the effectiveness of various strategies and interventions aimed at promoting women's political empowerment and gender equality.

 - (c) Key concepts: gender, patriarchy and feminism.
